Strike action With more strike action planned for 15th and 16th March 2023 I would like to reiterate how important good attendance is right now. We all agree that our children have missed so much already and it is not an easy decision for teachers to strike as we all want the best for our children. However please remember that this is not action against the school but is about concerns over teachers' pay and working conditions and the poor funding levels for schools.

Attendance so far this year still stands at 92.4% which is much lower than pre Covid times. Please remember that if your child is unable to attend school for any reason that you MUST inform the school office by 9am. I cannot emphasise this enough as any unauthorised absences may result in a fine.
