It was a brilliant experience for them all. The Year 1 children have also completed their phonics screening check and we are really proud of the excellent progress that they have made.

The children in Year 2 choreographed and created their own wake up shake up dance routine which they entered in a Stockport competition and won!

Year 3

This term, our Year 3 class has represented Outwood at The Cheshire Show which is a celebration of all things countryside and agriculture. The children hosted stalls and even won a rosette for 2nd place which was well deserved especially as all of the other classes attending were Year 6 children. The feedback we have had about our children was complementary and they really enjoyed the experience.

Year 4

We are really proud of our Year 4 children who sat the national multiplication tables check last week. They are the first class to do so as it was new this year. The multiplication tables check (MTC) is statutory for primary schools in the 2021/22 academic year and the purpose of the MTC is to determine whether pupils can recall their times tables fluently, which is essential for future success in mathematics. It will help teachers to identify pupils who have not yet mastered their times tables, so that additional support can be provided in the future.

Year 5 have been doing some exciting DT work where they they built machines to transport tomatoes across a 1m distance quickly and safely, in the hopes of helping farmers in Nepal who need a similar machine.
